DISCUSSION POINTS

Documentation of Existing Conditions

The Committee divided up into three groups. Each group was in charge of documenting the character of a particular section of the study area. Afterwards, each group briefly shared what they found.

Zoning Tools Discussion

The differences and advantages/disadvantages of Euclidean zoning, overlay zoning, design guidelines, and form-based codes were discussed.

Study Boundary

Keeping in mind the recommendations of the Small Area Study, the existing character, and potential zoning tools, the Committee divided up into three groups to discuss the possible boundaries for different types of development. While there was some general agreement for the boundaries of the downtown core and along Old Madison Pike, there was no consensus for the boundary or type of development along McCullum.
